STUDENT FOCUS


A Work Placement gives you the chance to gain hands-on experience of the working world. It helps you put the theory learned in your course into practice, explore the career opportunities within your chosen study programme and enhance your personal and professional development.

Whether Work Placement is compulsory or an elective option in your course, it can provide an invaluable entry into your chosen career. Work placement provides you with an opportunity to get experience of work in a professional and supervised environment. It enables your employer to have work tasks completed and to have the opportunity to assess you as a potential future employee. A Placement will enhance your knowledge and help with your studies, it will help you increase your self-awareness as a professional and also help you to find out more about your own abilities and career opportunities.

EMPLOYER FOCUS

Providing Work Placement gives you the opportunity to contribute to the education and development of a Placement student and helps embed employability into educational programme design and development. It will provide the chance for you to get work done, to engage with educational institutions and communicate your views on the education provided.

While having work tasks completed you have the opportunity to assess potential future employees, plan the development of your human resource needs and be exposed to new and perhaps novel developments in your area of business. Your contribution to student learning will enhance the overall quality of the people skills and competencies available to your business, to your sector of industry and to the economy in general. It can give you the opportunity to advertise your organization as a place of graduate employment and it can also be a way of meeting researchers to discuss potential project collaborations.

The provision of Work Placement in Higher Education courses is a major component of your organisation's contract with the nation. Work Placement resources your students with work-ready capabilities, cultivates relationships with employers and makes your educational programmes relevant to the future career prospects of your students.

Work Placement provides a direct link with industry enhancing existing relationships and cultivating new links with employers.
